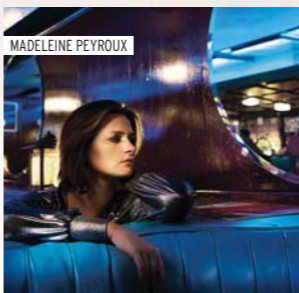

Gregory Porter made such an impression on us all last year we had to have him back, this time as Artist in Residence!

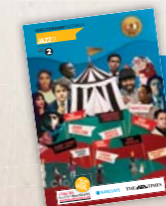

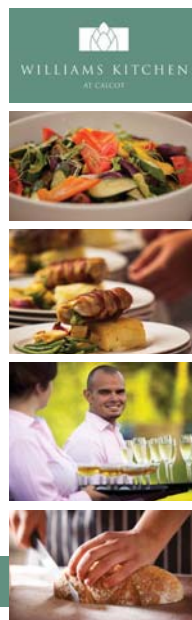
THE JAZZ KITCHEN
